

WEBSTER/NERINX EXHIBITION

Webster Arts invites high school art teachers to submit exceptional student artwork for a juried exhibition celebrating the creativity, ideas, and artistic voices of young artists.

This exhibition is an opportunity for students to have their work professionally exhibited in a community arts setting and for teachers to showcase the work being created in their classrooms.

ELIGIBILITY

- Open to high school students in grades 9–12.
- Artwork must be created by a currently enrolled student.
- Each teacher may submit up to 20 works for consideration.
- All visual art mediums are welcome, including drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, mixed media, digital art, and more.

PRESENTATION REQUIREMENTS

- 2D artwork must be matted and ready to hang.
- Artwork should be clean, finished, and securely prepared for exhibition.
- 3D artwork must be stable and ready for display.
- Please clearly label each artwork with the student's name, title, medium, school, and teacher's name.
- Artwork should be appropriate for display in a public community exhibition.

IMPORTANT DATES

INTENT TO PARTICIPATE FORM DUE:

December 16, 2026

Each teacher must submit this form estimating the number of students participating.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

April 1, 2027

All artwork and required submission information must be received by this date.

ARTWORK PICKUP:

April 20, 2027

Teachers are responsible for collecting student artwork on the designated pickup date.

WHY PARTICIPATE?

Give your students the opportunity to see their work out of the classroom and into the community. This exhibition celebrates the imagination, skill, experimentation, and unique perspectives of young artists while connecting high school art programs with the broader arts community.
